# Global English

NEAD's Global English project. Raises achievement in speaking and listening through engaging with local and global issues, using curriculum linked activities. Free support is provided for year 10 pupils and English departments from 5 Norfolk High Schools.

## Focus:

Improving speaking and listening skills, contributing to controlled assessments and offering opportunities to engage with schools' local communities.

Developing NEAD's successful We Are Norfolk project work – incorporating the World Voices team (local people from different countries, who present their culture and introduce global issues).

Teaming up International Development students at the University of East Anglia with pupils who contributed to post-graduate activities and research.

New partnerships with a wider reach, including BBC Voices project, offering filming and editing training, as well as loan of equipment in the project's first year.

71% improved speaking skills.

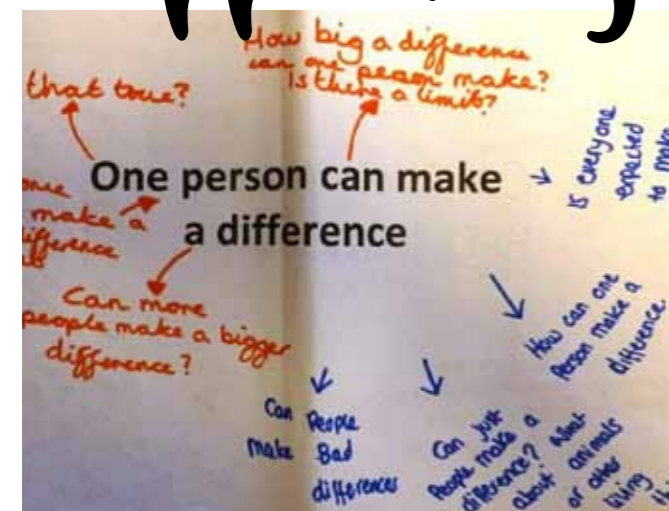
# Open to ALL Schools

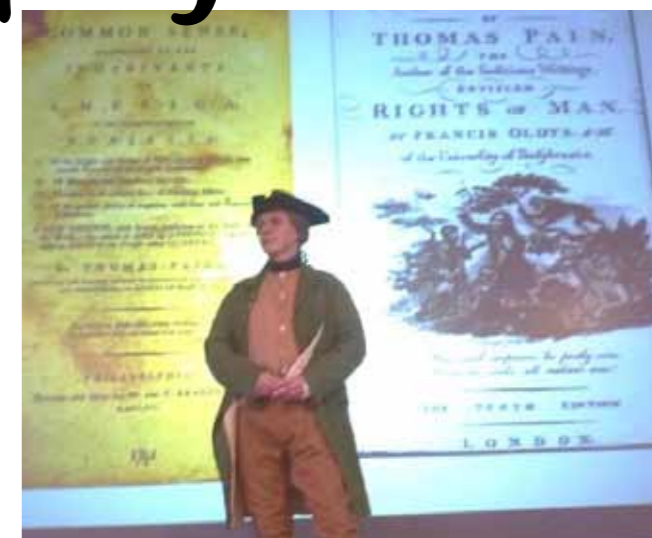
# Diverse Campaign Issues

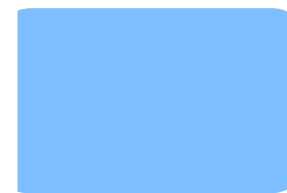
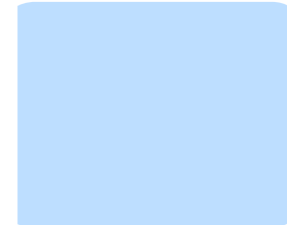

A Partnership Agreement will be introduced at the beginning of Year 2 ensuring both NEAD and participating schools are clear about what is required from each other for maximum project focus and outcomes.

NEAD will encourage more opportunities, earlier on, for community engagement, through e-mails, initial meetings and fliers at the beginning of the project year.

NEAD has acquired more film equipment enabling a smoother and quicker filming process.

A new NEAD Associates Agreement will be drawn up clarifying what is expected of external facilitators, aiding monitoring by the Global English Project Coordinator.

CPD sessions will be encouraged in all project schools, reinforcing and further building skills and confidence in teachers to deal with the global dimensions.
